Anchor 1

'Fathom Out': ascertain something; deduce from the facts

- Acquaint yourself with the bible, know that it's compiled of 66 books, divided into the Old and new Testament. know the literary style of the book you are reading through. Know who the author and who the audience was, etc.

Psalm 119:105 Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path.



Anchor 2

'Steady-The-Ship': To bring under control

- Be consistent and confident in your devotionals. As you submerge yourself into God's Word, the more of God's supernatural truths will rub off on you.

2 Corinthians 3:18 And we all, with unveiled face, beholding the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from one degree of glory to another. For this comes from the Lord who is the Spirit.



Anchor 3

'All Hands On Deck': all members of the team are involved

- Be a hearer and a teacher of the Bible. No one is exempt from talking about the Bible in a christian community.

1 Timothy 4: 12-13 Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. Until I come, devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to exhortation, to teaching.



Anchor 4

‘Learn The Ropes’: To learn or understand how to do something.

- Be practical. Learn how to read the Bible both formally and informally.
 - ACTS Method
 - OIAJ
 - Journal through a passage
 - Adoration Alphabet

James 1: 22-25 But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves. For if anyone is a hearer of the word and not a doer, he is like a man who looks intently at his natural face in a mirror. For he looks at himself and goes away and at once forgets what he was like. But the one who looks into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and perseveres, being no hearer who forgets but a doer who acts, he will be blessed in his doing.



Anchor 5

'Shipshape-Skipper': in good order; trim and neat // The captain of a ship or boat

- Not only is Jesus transforming and guiding us through this journey, he is the destination. He's the ultimate treasure we seek for, seen in all of scripture.

John 1:1-3 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through him, and without him was not anything made that was made.
